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Why Attics and Crawl Spaces Are Vulnerable


- Limited daily oversight allows pests to establish undetected

- Common pests include mice, rats, squirrels, raccoons, bats, cockroaches, and stored-product insects.

IPM Principles Applied to Attics & Crawl Spaces

Integrated Pest Management (IPM) focuses on prevention, monitoring, and targeted control. Key principles for attics and crawl spaces:



Inspection: Identify vulnerabilities and signs of pest activity



Exclusion: Seal entry points and reinforce structures



Sanitation: Reduce attractants like food, moisture, and debris



Monitoring: Use traps and visual checks to detect activity early



Targeted Intervention: Employ species-specific control methods only when needed

Seasonal Maintenance Checklist

Spring

- Inspect for winter rodent or wildlife activity
- Repair insulation damage, seal gaps around vents, pipes, and wiring
- Check moisture-prone areas for leaks or water accumulation
- Remove debris and organic matter

Summer

- Monitor for insect activity (ants, cockroaches, wasps)
- Maintain proper ventilation to prevent condensation
- Inspect stored items for insect infestations
- Ensure vents are screened and functioning

Fall

- Seal all potential rodent entry points before cold weather
- Inspect attic insulation for nesting materials
- Remove clutter in crawl spaces to reduce shelter for pests
- Check building perimeter for wildlife access points

Winter

- Continue monitoring for rodent activity inside walls or ceilings
- Inspect crawl space ventilation and moisture management systems
- Respond immediately to any new signs of pests
- Maintain proper sanitation and storage practices



Common Issues and How to Prevent Them

- Rodent gnawing and nesting: Seal gaps as small as 1/4 inch and install rodent-proof barriers
- Moisture and mold: Ensure drains, vapor barriers, and ventilation are functioning
- Insulation damage: Inspect and repair regularly to prevent nesting and structural weakening
- Stored material contamination: Keep items off floors and in sealed containers
